

The Ontario Secondary School Literacy Course (OSSLC) – OLC40 Course Profile Outline

Course Description/Rationale/Overview

This This course is designed to help students acquire and demonstrate the cross-curricular literacy skills that are evaluated by the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT). Students who complete the course successfully will meet the provincial literacy requirement for graduation. Students will read a variety of informational, narrative, and graphic texts and will produce a variety of forms of writing, including summaries, information paragraphs, opinion pieces, and news reports. Students will also maintain and manage a portfolio containing a record of their reading experiences and samples of their writing.

Eligibility requirement

Students who have been eligible to write the OSSLT at least twice and who have been unsuccessful at least once are eligible to take the course. (Students who have already met the literacy requirement for graduation may be eligible to take the course under special circumstances, at the discretion of the principal.)

Class Requirements:

Student Responsibility

Students must seek assistance from the teacher and fellow students for all work missed due to absence and must make arrangements to complete missed work.

Course Requirements/Department Policies

Attendance requirement

Students are required to log in least once per week on course activity. Students are expected to spend approximately 7 hours per week for both online and offline learning activities. Students are required to keep a Student Learning Log for each course documenting online and offline activities.

What is considered an Absence?

If a student fails to login in two consecutive weeks, it will be considered as one absence. When a student has 2 absences, the school will issue a warning letter.

By mid-term (within two months from the start of a course), if a student fails to complete 40% of course work, the principal may ask the student to withdraw from the course.

Evaluation
