Course Description/Rationale/Overview

This course prepares students to use English with increasing fluency and accuracy in classroom and social situations and to participate in Canadian society as informed citizens. Students will develop the oral-presentation, reading, and writing skills required for success in all school subjects. They will extend listening and speaking skills through participation in discussions and seminars; study and interpret a variety of grade-level texts; write narratives, articles, and summaries in English; and respond critically to a variety of print and media texts.

Course Outline

Unit 1 – Socio-Cultural Competence and Media Literary

By the end of the course, students will:

- Identifying media codes and conventions
- Understanding good speaking and listening in media text
- Exploring cultural settings
- Understanding plot, tragedy, feud, obstacles, resolution through movie clips
- Exploring Art and Culture of Canada

Unit 2 – Reading

By the end of the course, students will:

- Infer and deduce information
- Understanding literary conflicts, settings, characters
- Exploring author's tone
- Matching and identifying literary terms and literary devices
- Developing Reading skills: Compare and Contrast, Looking for Clue words, Build on what you've learned, Cause and Effect

Unit 3 – Listening and Speaking

By the end of the course, students will:

- Listening and Speaking through a play
- Social, Historical and Cultural context
- Developing an argument in a speech
- Developing Grammar skills: Adverbs with Verb, Present Perfect Progressive, Passive Voice, If Conditionals

Unit 4 – Writing

By the end of the course, students will:

- Elements of a short story and short story analysis
- Figurative language and identifying themes
- Character analysis with interlopers and character chart
- Newspaper analysis and news report
- Developing Grammar skills: Negative questions, Gerund and Infinitive, Transition words and phrases
